Is the program expense in line with the projected number to be served?</p>	<p>Four Fourteen Fifteen Sixteen Seventeen</p>	<p>A: When the number served listed in question 15 is compared to the number in need listed in question 3, it is clear that the program is making an impact. B: The applicant has demonstrated that the requested funding is proportionate to the number projected to be served. C: The applicant has explained any reduction in the number served (or lack of increase), explained any expense increases in the program budget, any lack of other revenue sources and justified their United Way funding request.</p>

B: It is also based on past results or established best practices. If it's based on something else, it is identified and credible. C: <u>Previously Funded Program:</u> The program achieved all of it's objectives submitted in the last two years of United Way funding applications, as demonstrated by the Mid-Year and Year-End Reports. <u>Not Previously Funded Program:</u> The applicant reports past achievement of the program's objectives, including number-served projections.</p>

B: All action steps include a timeline, as well as a projected number served. C: All action steps include a description of intended results.</p>

Program Budget To what extent does the program budget meet requirements?</p>	<p>Fourteen Fifteen Thirteen</p>	<p>A: Funding request is not more than 50% of the total program budget and there are at least three other funding sources. B: All revenue and expense items are clearly identified and the budget is balanced. C: All expenses listed in the allocation budget are directly tied to essential components of service delivery.</p>

Plan of Action to Achieve Performance Indicator How likely is it that the Program's "Plan of Action" will result in the successful achievement of the selected performance indicator?</p>	<p>Eight</p>	<p>A: The action steps are appropriate and the most effective way to achieve the selected performance indicator selected in Question 5. B: The intended result of each action step is directly tied to achieving the selected performance indicator. C: The applicant has provided a persuasive, valid and sound explanation that demonstrates the submitted action steps will accomplish the selected performance indicator.</p>

Effectiveness of Services When Compared to Similar Services To what extent does this program avoid pure duplication and has developed componets so that their service is unique and more effective than similar services?</p>	<p>Eighteen</p>	<p>A. The applicant has described how the program's services are unique when compared to similar programs. The comparison is relevant and persuasive. B. The description also includes concrete program components that have been demonstrated to be more effective than similar programs. C. Program staff works with the staff of other programs providing similar services in a symbiotic partnership to more effectively meet the need in Chatham County.</p>		
<p>8. Program Evaluation and Improvement Implementation Does the program include annual evaluation and improvement implementation processes to enhance service quality and delivery?</p>	<p>Twelve</p>	<p>A: The program has an established annual evaluation process. B: It has also demonstrated a history of implementing improvements. C: The applicant provided sufficient documentation that the program's quality and service delivery have been improved through the implimentation of program changes.</p>		
<p>9. Sufficient Use of Evidence-Informed Model To what extent does this program follow an evidence-informed model for designing services and achieving the selected United Way goal (question 5)?</p>	<p>Nine</p>	<p>A: The program is based on an evidence-informed model, research-based approach or best practice. B: The applicant has cited demonstrated results from the evidence-informed model, research-based approach or best practice they are using as a basis for this program. C: The applicant has explained how they have tailored the evidence-informed model, research-based approach or best practice to meet the needs of chatham to the extent that similar results can be expected.</p>
