WHO WE ARE

Since 1985 United Way of Chatham County has been a trusted leader in the community, bringing people together to give, advocate and volunteer to make Chatham County stronger. UWCC is the largest human services funder in Chatham County, and program funding serves one in three Chatham residents. Like most organizations, we are challenged to meet the needs of our county and effectively drive change with limited resources. Donations from community members and businesses enable us to achieve our goals for the community.

WHAT WE DO

We focus on three key impact areas - education, financial stability and health - to create long-term, community-wide change.



EDUCATION

We help children achieve their potential by:

- Ensuring access to quality childcare that prepares children for school and learning.
- Supporting programs that teach young people positive life skills.
- Helping students maintain or improve grade point average and stay in school.



FINANCIAL STABILITY

We promote financial stability and independence by:

- Supporting the provision of basic needs like food, rent and utilities.
- Ensuring access to programs that provide job training, education and placement that leads to employment opportunities.



HEALTH

We promote the overall health of the community by:

- Improving access to health care services.
- Promoting early intervention services and preventative care.
- Supporting programs that encourage healthy lifestyles.



HOW WE DO IT

We partner with Chatham nonprofits that help carry forth our focus areas, and each year we invite them to submit program applications for funding from our annual Impact Fund.

ALLOCATIONS PROCESS

United Way donors and volunteers review applications using a rubric, ensuring the
programs meet United Way funding criteria. Volunteers also make site visits to
observe service delivery, and meet with agency representatives. After a thorough
evaluation, they work together to make funding recommendations for the review and
approval of the United Way Board of Directors.

ACCOUNTABILITY AND REPORTING

We track the progress of each program against pre-defined goals. Our nonprofit
agencies must submit mid-year and year-end reports that include challenges and
successes and show the impact they are making with United Way funding.

OUR COMMITTMENT

 With a 15% operating budget, .85 cents of every dollar is invested back into the community. Through our generous donors we allocate \$345,000 into 17 Chatham County nonprofit programs. The needs and programs within our community continue to grow, and we need additional support more than ever. See below for additional funding we've given to agencies in need.

What is the Chatham Housing Collective?

In 2022 United Way began the Chatham Housing Collective (CHC) in partnership with Chatham County Government. In the last year the CHC has transformed to a United Way Program that represents a new way of collaborating to better serve residents in need of housing support.



The work is achieved under the guiding values of inclusion, respect, accountability, and collaboration. Under United Way's leadership, Chatham County will be able to define impact based on client-centered, community level outcomes.

What is the Impact of the CHC?

The CHC measures impact not in terms of agency level outputs, but instead in terms of community-level outcomes that focus on a specific change for a targeted group of people. The CHC has defined Chatham's community-level outcomes as follows:

- Households experiencing homelessness increase their access to case management services.
- Households who are unsheltered find safe, temporary shelter.
- Homeless service providers coordinate services and housing for households in need.
- The number of available units for those experiencing a housing crisis increases.
- The Chatham County Housing Collective has the diverse resources needed to accomplish community improvements in housing/homeless services.

TRANSPARENCY

Our Impact Fund supports 17 nonprofit programs in the Chatham community, and touches one in three Chatham County residents. As our county grows, our funding requests grow, and we need your help to support the increasing needs of our community. There are several ways to make a donation and make a difference.
